

The European Week for Waste Reduction (EWWR) is set to kick off its 15th edition from 18 to 26 November 2023. During this week, 14,522 actions focusing on waste reduction, product reuse and repair, materials recycling, and clean-ups will take place across 29 countries in Europe and beyond.

## The EWWR 2023 in numbers

The EWWR is a leading international campaign advocating waste prevention during a dedicated week in November. Participants from schools, public administrations, companies, NGOs and citizens collaborate to organise awareness activities on local to international scales. The objective of these actions is to change the behaviour surrounding consumption patterns and waste generation habits with the aim of contributing to reach waste reduction and climate neutrality targets.

In 2023, 14,522 actions will be carried out with the help of 35 national and regional coordinators in 29 countries.

Fostering awareness: exploring the environmental impact packaging



The 15th edition of the European Week for Waste Reduction seeks to raise awareness about the strong environmental impact of packaging, promoting a more sustainable consumption and production behavior. The EWWR is focusing on packaging for the second time in its history (the first time was during the 2016 edition). Even after 7 years, this topic keeps being key in terms of waste produced, which has not been reduced but pushed forward with the increase of the e-commerce sector.

Packaging plays a crucial role in our daily lives, serving various functions throughout the product supply chain. However, its extensive use contributes significantly to environmental issues. A substantial portion of plastics and paper in the EU is

dedicated to packaging, with 36% of municipal solid waste attributed to its disposal. Between 2012 and 2020, the volume of non-recyclable packaging increased. In response, the European Commission aims to make all packaging economically feasible for reuse or recycling by 2030, emphasizing the **importance of waste prevention** in achieving this goal.
